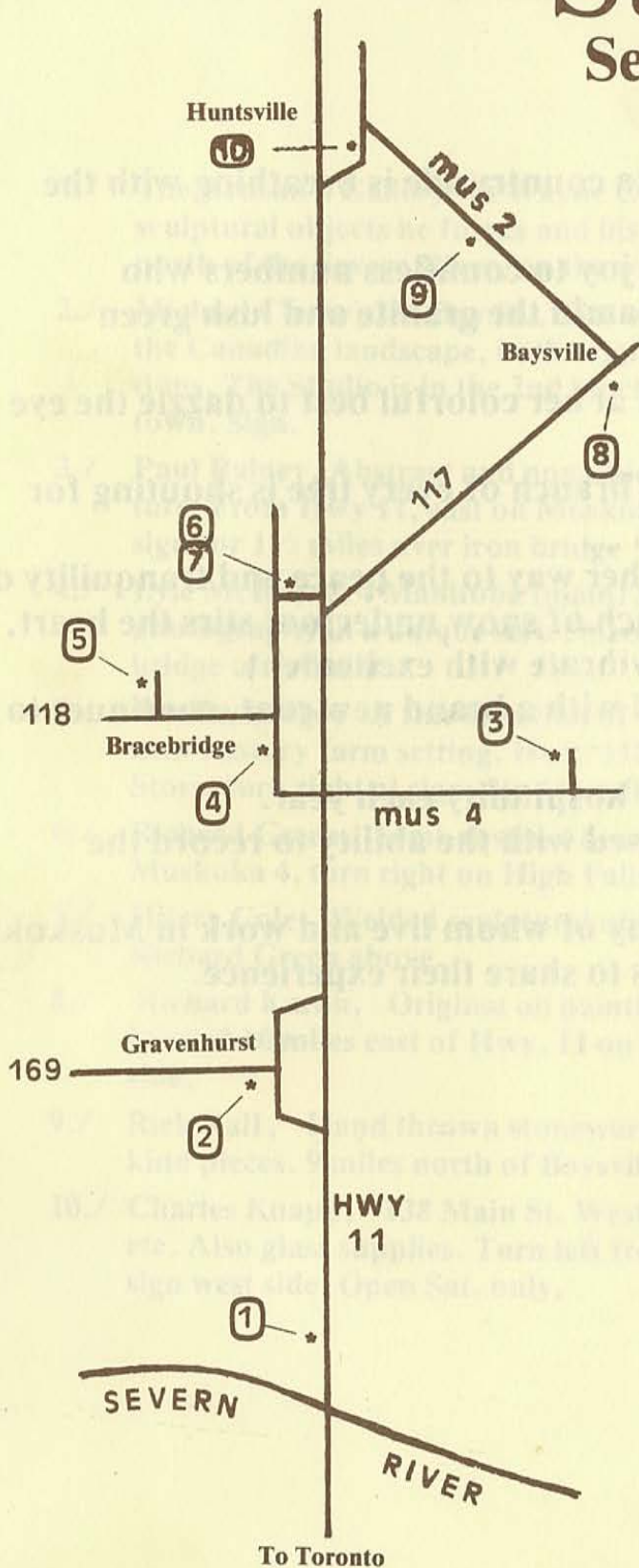

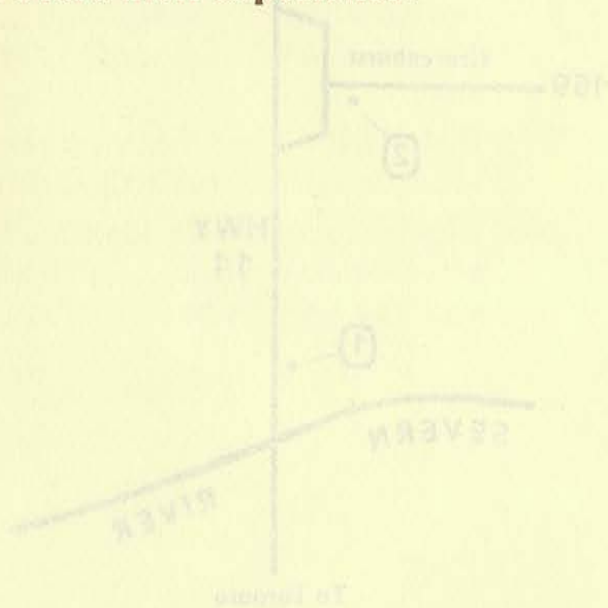
Then spring. The Lady washes up and with a brand new coat, continues to entertain her guests.

Muskoka Autumn Studio Tour

- 1./ **The Artisan's Gallery.** In Wayne Church's Studio you will see the functional and sculptural objects he forges and his oil and acrylic paintings. The Gallery is 1 mile north of the Severn River, on the west side of Hwy. 11.
- 2./ **Michael Cleary, 221 Bay St., Gravenhurst.** Beautifully detailed watercolours of the Canadian landscape, both original paintings and signed, numbered reproductions. The Studio is in the 2nd block west of the traffic lights in the centre of town. Sign.
- 3./ **Paul Rainey, Abstract and non objective paintings, oil and acrylic, some sculpture.** From Hwy 11, east on Muskoka 4 three miles, turn left at "Mathiasville" sign for 1½ miles over iron bridge ¼ mile and look for sign.
- 4./ **Lyle McIntyre, 4 Manitoba (main) St., Bracebridge.** Portrait and landscape photography in a unique style. Sizes 11" X 14" to 30" X 40". Just north of bridge on left side.
- 5./ **Jon Partridge, A fine selection of utilitarian and sculptural ware set in a quaint near century farm setting.** Hwy. 118 west of Bracebridge, 1 mile past Dominion Store, turn right at sign. Up 1½ miles then turn left.
- 6./ **Richard Green, Semi-abstract bronze figures.** 3 miles north of Bracebridge on Muskoka 4, turn right on High Falls Rd. over railway tracks, 300 yds. on left.
- 7./ **Hilary Cole, Welded sculptural objects and works of art.** Same location as Richard Green above.
- 8./ **Richard Karon, Original oil paintings of the Muskoka landscape.** The Studio is located 10 miles east of Hwy. 11 on Hwy. 117, just west of Baysville on the south side.
- 9./ **Rick Vail, Hand thrown stoneware and porcelain.** Some handbuilt and one of a kind pieces. 9 miles north of Baysville on Muskoka # 2.
- 10./ **Charles Knapp, 138 Main St. West Huntsville.** Stained Glass, lamps, hangings, etc. Also glass supplies. Turn left from Muskoka 2 on to Main St. and look for sign west side. Open Sat. only.
