

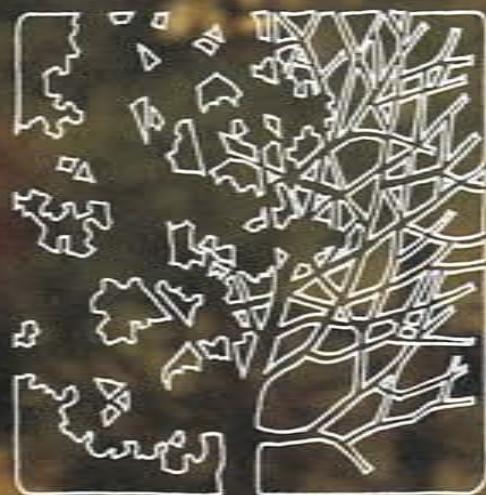

Due to parking limitations bus tours are not advised.

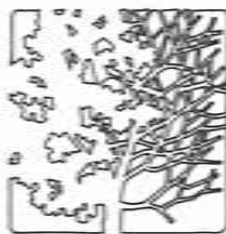
Note: Some studios may be closed for preparations just prior to the Tour.

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A. Brenda Wainman Goulet. Enjoy Brenda's distinctive bronze-on-stone landscapes, whimsical figures and other surprises at her studio/gallery on Walker Lake. Watch her demonstrate the ancient "lost wax" process by which she creates her unique bronze sculptures. 12 km. east of Huntsville along Hwy 60, at Limberlost Rd. (Muskoka Rd 8), turn left (north), go 3 km. to Upper Walker Lake Rd., turn left, then right at the stop sign, RR 4 Box 254, Huntsville, P0A 1K0. (705) 635-1996. Hours: Special shows, by chance or appointment.

B. Jeff Miller, Painter, works on location in oils and acrylics. Paintings herald the theme - wilderness is our HOME PLACE. 12 km. east of Huntsville along Hwy. 60, at Limberlost Rd. (Muskoka Rd. 8) turn north (left); go 150 metres to sign, turn left, go 150 metres up hill, bearing right to studio on right. RR 4 Huntsville, P0A 1K0. (705) 635-2754. C. Charles Knapp Stained Glass. New studio location! New lamp and window designs. Take Hwy 60, 4 km. east from Huntsville to Canal Rd. (Deerhurst exit) and turn right. Turn right again at Y intersection. Go over the bridge and at the 2nd Y intersection turn right onto Swallowdale Rd. Studio is second house on the right. Box 2429 Huntsville, P0A 1K0. (705) 789-8291. Hours: We are usually available to receive visitors but you may like to call ahead. Sundays closed.

D. Eric Lindgren. Lindgren Pottery presents handmade stoneware pottery: special pieces and a line of functional pots, including dinnerware, for the kitchen, table, and garden; all designed for beauty and function. E. Ken Hoeght, Earth Park Pottery. Porcelain and stoneware is formed into unique, functional pieces using various Japanese techniques, giving warm and earthy tones. G. Doug Gatcke. Carved burl bowls and marquetry are featured at the Artistry in Wood Studio on Butterfly Lake in Glen Orchard.
